ADMISSION RULES & REGULATIONS: 2025-26

1. A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination with English for a minimum of 100 marks and must have passed in English are eligible to apply for 4-year (Eight Semester) UG Course with Honours in a Major and Honours with Research with a Major and 3-year (Six Semester) UG General Course under Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF) 2022.
2. Candidates opting for Practical based subjects are required to get passed both in theoretical and practical papers at the Higher Secondary Examination.
3. No candidate shall be allowed for admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing previous qualifying examination or discontinuation of recognized regular Course of Studies after passing the previous qualifying examination.
4. Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not require to submit Migration Certificate for getting Registration under Calcutta University.
5. Students who have passed with atleast 35 percent marks in aggregate (excluding Environmental Studies/Education) the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or equivalent or in Vocational education conducted by West Bengal Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the 3-year (Six Semester) UG General Course in Arts.
6. Students who have passed with atleast 35 percent marks in aggregate (excluding Environmental Studies/Education) the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or equivalent or in Vocational education in Business and Commerce conducted by West Bengal Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the 3-year (Six Semester) UG General Course in Commerce.
7. Candidates who have passed Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) in Science Stream are also eligible to apply for 4-year (Eight Semester) UG Course with Honours in a Major and Honours with Research in a Major in B.A. and B.Com and 3-year (Six Semester) UG General Course in B.A. and B.Com besides 4-year (Eight Semester) UG Course with Honours in a Major and Honours with Research in a Major in B.Sc. and 3-year (Six Semester) UG General Course in B.Sc.

8. (a) A candidate taking up 4 year (Eight Semester) Honours Course in a Major subject must have obtained:
- (i) A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination
 - Or
 - (ii) 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination
 - Or
 - (iii) 50% marks in the aggregate when the candidate has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied (Only for B.A./B.Sc Honours Courses)
- (b) However, candidates belonging to the reserved categories taking up Honours in Major Course of Study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.
9. Related Subjects considered for Honours in a Major:
- (a) For B.Com Honours Course with Major in “**Accounting and Finance**”, the word “Subject” or “related subject” shall mean the following:
- Accountancy, Business Economics including Business Mathematics, Business Organisation, Mathematics, Business Mathematics, Economics, Statistics, Business Studies, Office and Secretarial Practice, Financial Accounting, Elements of Cost Accountancy and Auditing, Book Keeping, Commerce, Cost Accountancy and Principle of Management, Commercial Law and preliminaries of Auditing, Costing and Taxation.
- (b) For B.A Honours Course with Major in **Education**: The subjects Psychology/Philosophy/ Mathematics/Sociology/Economics/Political Science/History/Statistics/Physics/Chemistry/ Biology will be treated as related subject.
- (c) For B.A Honours Course with Major in **Philosophy**: The subjects Psychology/Mathematics/ Education/Sociology/Political Science will be treated as related subject.
10. Some special conditions for taking up Major Courses as follows:
- (a) For B.Sc Honours Course with Major in **Mathematics**: A candidate who have passed in Mathematics/Applied Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination. A student who has passed Business Mathematics is not eligible for admission.
- (b) For B.Sc Honours Course with Major in **Economics**: A candidate shall be allowed to take up Honours with Major in Economics if he/she passed in Mathematics/Business Mathematics/Applied Mathematics at the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination.

Students who have passed Business Economics including Business Mathematics in Higher Secondary (10+2) level from West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education are also eligible for admission in Honours Course with Major in Economics. Students with Honours in Major in Economics will **have to take up Mathematics** as one of the Minor subjects.

(c) For B.Sc Honours Course with Major in **Geography**: Students with Honours in Major in Geography will **have to take up Economics or Mathematics** as one of the Minor subjects.

11. A candidate shall be allowed to take up the subject(s) under heading 'A' if he/she has passed the subject(s) under heading 'B' at the previously qualifying examination:

Mathematics	Mathematics/Applied Mathematics
Physics	Physics and Mathematics
Chemistry	Chemistry

12. For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the 4 year (Eight Semester) Honours Course of study in a Major aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks scored in the subject plus the marks scored in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by the candidate. For admission to 3 year (Six semester) General course only the marks scored in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by the candidate will be considered. Marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. If the subject Environmental Science is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.
13. Reservation Policy for admission 4 year (Eight Semester) Honours Course of study in a Major or 3-year (Six Semester) UG General Course will be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013, the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014 and Memorandum of Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) in admission in the Higher Educational Institution in the State of West Bengal, vide notification No. 339-Edn(CS)/OM-74L/2023 dated 26/5/2023.
- (a) Persons with disabilities having 40% and above degree of disability will enjoy a 3% reservation
14. (horizontal) in each of the categories, i.e. in SC, ST, OBC-A, OBC-B and in the Unreserved or General Category, and such candidates, if available, shall be placed towards the top of the list prepared for each category of students.

(b) The PWD candidates claiming seats under reserved category are required to produce appropriate PWD certificates issued by the competent authority satisfying the following criteria:

Officer-in-Charge or Medical Head of Primary Health Centres, Block Primary Health Centres, State General Hospitals, Rural Hospit, als, Sub-Divisional Hospitals or the District Hospitals run by the State Government or any hospital run by a statutory body or authority.

(c) PWD candidates hailing from states other than West Bengal are not eligible for such benefits and they will be treated as General category candidates.

15. The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by any of the following authorities in prescribed format as given in Annexure C of Memo No. 325-PAR(AR)3P-1/2019 dated 09/07/2019 issued by the Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department, GoWB:

- (1) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate
- (2) Sub-Divisional Officer
- (3) DWO, Kolkata for Kolkata Municipal Corporation Area.
